**MILKMAN'S BERRY VACATION.**  
 A Cavalry Cavalry Settles Down near Birmingham, only to be home again in ten months.

One day last week deputy sheriff J. O. Beattie received a telephone message from a party in Pontiac who refused to give his name, but requested Beattie to meet him at the toll gate north of the village just after dark. Jim assured the man that he would be on hand and when he kept the appointment he found the man was sheriff Duhaime and wanted a man named Jackson Palmer with another convict named Con Kane.
