Mr. Comstock's income tax bill in the House a few days ago, provides that all individual estates, the income of which is \$2,000 or more, shall pay 1 percent tax; \$5,000 or over, 2 percent; \$10,000 and over, 3 percent; \$15,000 and over, 4 percent; \$20,000 and over, 5 percent; \$30,000 and over, 6 percent.
