James Tanner, commissioner of Pensions. Corporal James Tanner was born in Schuyler county, New York, 1844, and in 17 years old went to the front at the outbreak of the civil war, enlisting in the 87th New York regiment. He was in the battles of Yorktown, Fair Oaks, Williamsburg, at the seven days battle in front of Richmond, at Manassas, Antietam, Gettysburg, and at the battle of Bull Run, then a corporal, he had both legs shot off; he was a prisoner of war for ten days on the field, paroled and brought to Fairfax hospital for treatment. He then became clerk in the war department and in that position Lincoln was shot. He was called to the bedside of the dying President to take stenographic notes of some testimony relative to the assassination. Tanner left the war department in 1867, went to Brooklyn, where he was admitted to the bar, and became collector of taxes and entered active into politics. Corporal Tanner has been particularly active in pension affairs, and has taken much interest in pensioning soldiers advocating pension all round. Since 1884, he has been on the lecture platform. He stumped Indiana and Oregon for Harrison and Kentucky for Harrison's election being kindly announced himself as a candidate for the commissionship of pension. Few men are better known in New York than he, and he has attracted an audience as large as the signal for outburst of enthusiasm.
