Dec. 20.—Gen. L. B. Barnes, editor of the Michigan Farmer, claims that Michigan wheat stands lower in the grain market world today than ever before, and has a decided tendency to fall. He is forced to make an adjustment Friday, as he claims that to aim to produce the highest quality wheat in the market, he must market in the best possible shape. Mr. Gilchrist, a wholesale distributor of wheat by steamship, says that the market has brought about his deplorable condition, and recommends the extension of the time of storage of wheat in voyage to Detroit, in all points, until the time when wheat is marketed. This would put a stop to the practice of giving the farmer the full price, besides acting as an incentive to grow wheat and to buy wheat.
