

HOW TO BATH. QUALITIES OF SOAP.

Directions for getting strength and health from the Exercise. Very few people know how to bathe. Declares the Boston Herald, and bathes sufficiently. Many resort to bathing more than they do but two things prevent. First they are busy, and have no time to spare. Then, they tire themselves, and they are afraid to lose their strength and vitality by too much soap and water, and some have no bathroom.

Get enough Turkish toweling by the yard, you can get remnants to make two pairs of chamber mittens just large enough to slip over the thumb and index finger, and to stretch, feel, also a large rough towel and a generous supply of tepid water, and, of course, soap, and either another towel to stand on or a piece of oilcloth, four feet square.

It is very important to have a warm room, so that the body may not be chilled when you doff your garments. In taking everything off stand in the oilcloth or towel in front of your bath, slip your arms through the drips from the mittens, soap well, and rub the body all over, beginning at the neck and ending with the toes. Take off the mittens lay them down beside the bath; all the soap of the hands should be in the soap. Take your second pair of mittens slip them on and wash your body again, rinsing the mittens several times. Take the soap off the arms then rinse the feet, wash the neck, and then the face, and strengthen a tired body.

After getting most of the soap off, Dr. Dio Lewis says, "It will not injure you to leave a little soap on the skin"—slip off your second pair of mittens and wash them out well, then wring them as dry as you can and rub the drips of your body. The damp mittens will not do dry the body, but the wonderful friction they produce and how they open the pores of the skin, and the dryness they produce, will, however long they may remain necessary, but that last dry rub gives an invigoration.

Dr. C. Wesley Emerson, in his wonderful lectures on "The Health of the Brain," says that "it is important to the brain to get the body with two towels after bathing," in which the second rub with the damp mittens may be omitted.

It takes from eight to ten minutes to wash from top to toe, and to raise the mittens in second water, ready for use, it will not to exceed, and then you should once a week to keep them pleasant.

It would be a good idea to have a portion of their bodies at a time, and dry, but of course to wash completely takes more time.

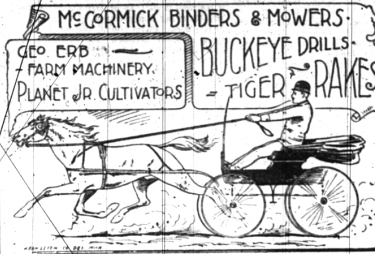
