Struck by Lightning - During a local electrical storm at Northville at 3 o'clock yesterday morning the Globe Furniture plant was struck by lightning and the four-story wooden factory with its contents, including costly machinery and unfinished work, was destroyed. The fire department was called at an early hour, was necessarily slow in arriving. Two companies were summoned from Plymouth. All fought bravely, but owing to the inflammable contents of the buildings burned like matches. The loss is nearly \$50,000, the insurance \$25,500.
