In a letter from London to the Indianapolis News Julian Raiph asks Why is it that in every capital in Europe—except London—there are large and attractively appointed resorts for men and women, at which they can rest and meet one another, tend to their families and friends, listen to music, observe their neighbors and yet pay only the price of a glass of beer apiece or of a glass of wine? I asked this question of a thoughtful and traveled Englishman today. I said to him "There is nothing of the kind in all England and yet wherever there are such places on the continent and England frequented by them with evident enjoyment, in all London there is but one hotel built by men and women and children, men resort to grand hotels and restaurants and clubs which contain a large staff of clerks which form a caste in themselves and then they are left to the care of the men and women of the land."
