He also testified that on this occasion he arranged for the purchase of two mortgages on Detroit property recently received by White and Marsh, and let Col. Sutton have an interest of \$1000 in these mortgages on condition that the latter deposit his wife's credit, the \$1000 paid him that week, by the Remonding Arms Co. These two mortgages aggregated \$1000 and it was arranged that Mr. Williams would not receive the money until the mortgage on the property owned by Tom Johnson was in his possession. Williams advanced the \$1000 when ever Johnson wanted the money.

Mr. Williams was unable to produce the wedding check, saying that it had been destroyed, but he produced a stub of the check, the \$1000, and a receipt, which he said was destroyed, and the mortgage cross-examination. ## FOREIGN TROOPS IN CHINA.

### Must Be Sent There to Protect the Exports of Goods—The Beer Enthusiasts Have Made Known Their Plans for the Present Week—Other Events.

Cannot Live in the U. S.

James P. O'Rourke, alias "King of the Road" and his partner, John J. McQuinn, who have been indicted for the murder of a man in Ireland when they were sentenced for complicity in the Phoenix park murders of 1922, have on the 23d evaded the hands of Special Agents at the immigration station in New York and ordered deported. The exclusion was made under the interpretation of the law which forbids anyone being admitted to this country who has been adjudged guilty of a felony crime of infamy, crime of violence or crime involving moral turpitude.

The two men were recently pardoned by Lord Cavanagh, first lieutenant of Ireland, from a sentence of life imprisonment and came to New York upon the 15th of this month. They were accompanied by a man of the name of Thomas, who is known to the Irish in New York and Ireland as "Tommy" and who was a member of the Irish Republican Army.

## TRANSVAAL WAR ITEMS.

The Bloemfontein bridge was destroyed by the Boers. They refrained from the retreat to Bloemfontein, where they are destroying the bridges and telegraph lines almost completely.
