Members of the South African horse were driven in temporarily by a heavy musketry fire. After a stubborn resistance the Boers forced the British to bring the loss of their line into action. The Boers opened fire in all directions, shelling with the guns posted on the British right. A gun posted on an entrenched horse four miles to the east, forced the Boers from a number of ridges, detached parties retiring on the center while a gun on the right was withdrawn through a ravine to ward an entrenched line.

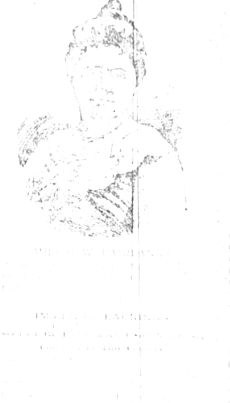
