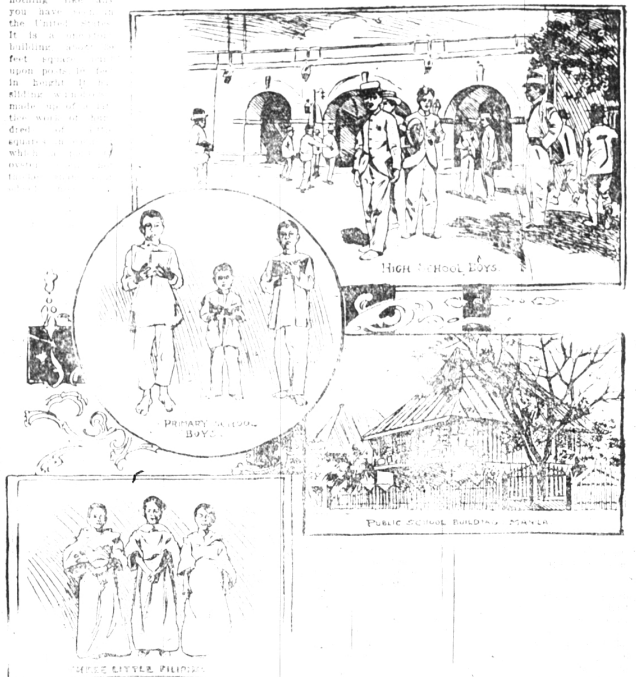


SCHOOLS IN THE PHILIPPINES.

Frank G. Carpenter, the noted newspaper correspondent now in the Philippines, sends the following descriptive letter about the introduction of the American free school in Manila. I have visited a number of the public schools of Manila. I am surprised at the quickness and intelligence of the pupils.

Let me take you into one of the schools, and show you just how it looks. It is a primary school for as yet little more than the primary grades have been established. 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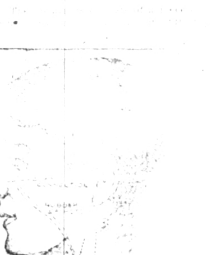

He Eats Without a Mouth.

John Thompson, a 57-year-old patient at the Deaconess Hospital, New York, has been suffering for several months from dysphagia. His food was kept in his mouth by a tube, and his teeth knocked out and his mouth so injured that he could not take food in the ordinary way.
