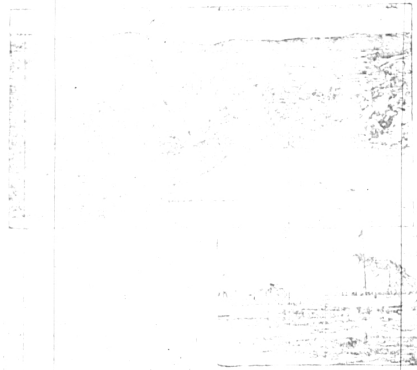


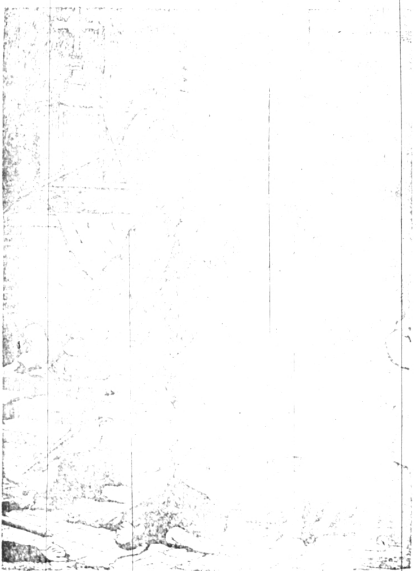
TAKING THE FORTS AT TAKU

WOMEN DOCTORS. Women doctors are becoming more and more numerous in the United States. They are not only practicing medicine, but also serving in the military and naval services.

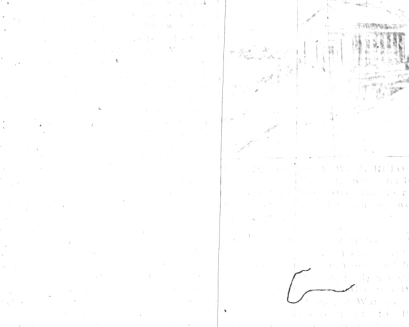
Why Soldiers Carry Sticks. Soldiers carry sticks for a variety of reasons, including for protection, as a tool, and as a symbol of authority.

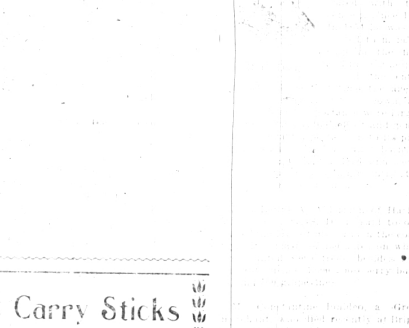
