Don't judge of a person's disposition by the sample presented to you at the first meeting.
The mists in the evening on low-lying marsh lands are caused by the cooling of the air when the sun has set.
Clouds are formed from the condensed vapors rising from the earth, and differ from mist only in occupying higher regions of atmosphere.
Why clouds stay in a higher atmosphere is because when composed of exceedingly small particles the rate at which such particles move is so slow that they partake of the current of air and are buoyed up and driven along.
When this watery vapor becomes more condensed, the particles settle and fall as rain.
The fall is changed into snow when the temperature is cold enough to freeze the condensed moisture.
As thousands of different forms of the snowflake have been observed.
In the same snowfall the forms of the crystals are generally about the same shape.
If the temperature of the air is not quite so cold, the snowflakes are partly thinned in falling through, and reach the earth as sleet.
When the snow, or more often sleet, passes suddenly through a very cold stratum of air, the result is hail.
