The early Christians in many countries used to greet one another on Easter morning with the salutation "Christ is risen."

The reply to this was "Christ is risen indeed and hath appeared to Simon."

This custom, it is said, is still observed in the Greek church.

The giving of eggs at Easter, or its spring festival, is one of the most widely known as it is also one of the oldest of the customs. From the earliest times the egg has stood for the birth of a new life. In the Eastern nations as the symbol of the universe and its budding at that time represented the opening of the new life of the year. When the custom was carried over into Christian practice the Easter eggs were usually painted with holy water. In later times the coloring and decorating of the egg was introduced and in a few years it had become a general custom.
