RELICS OF THE INDIANS.

Interesting Discoveries Made in the State of Maine.

A rare treat has been offered Indian relics buried at Kineo during the past week. The work of grading in front of the hotel has been undertaken and the plows and harrows have unearthed hundreds of arrowheads, many spearheads and various kinds of flint tools. Tradition has it that the ground broken up was formerly a burying ground of the Indians who came here from the east coast of Maine about 1500 years ago to secure flint from the mountains for the purpose of making arrowheads, spearheads, tomahawks and crude stone tools. It is also said that many a battle had been fought in this vicinity and valuable Indian relics have been discovered here from time to time.

EXTERMINATED BY THE BOERS.

The Quagga Hunted Out of Existence in South Africa.

The quagga, a South African animal of the Swain's resembling the zebra, which was hunted out of existence by the Boers for his hide, is now extinct. It was first seen in 1662, and was the last survivor of its kind, as far as the known world is concerned. It was first seen in the London Zoological Garden in 1872. It is described in an article on the subject in Knowledge (London), says: "Even in the days of its abundance the quagga varied by the way, taking its name from its cry, had a comparatively limited distribution, ranging from the Cape Colony to the eastern side of Africa, as far as the Vaal river, beyond which it appears to have been unknown. In this respect it closely resembled the white-flanked gnu, which, however, is known to have crossed that river in one district. Curiously enough, the two species lived in close neighborhood, and in the old days their vast herds formed a striking feature in the landscape of the open plains of the Orange River Colony. Owing to its rank fleshy and especially its yellow fat, the flesh of the quagga was almost unobtainable by Europeans, although it was heavily relished by the Hottentots, who, in the early days of Cape Colony, were largely fed upon it by their Dutch masters."

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
