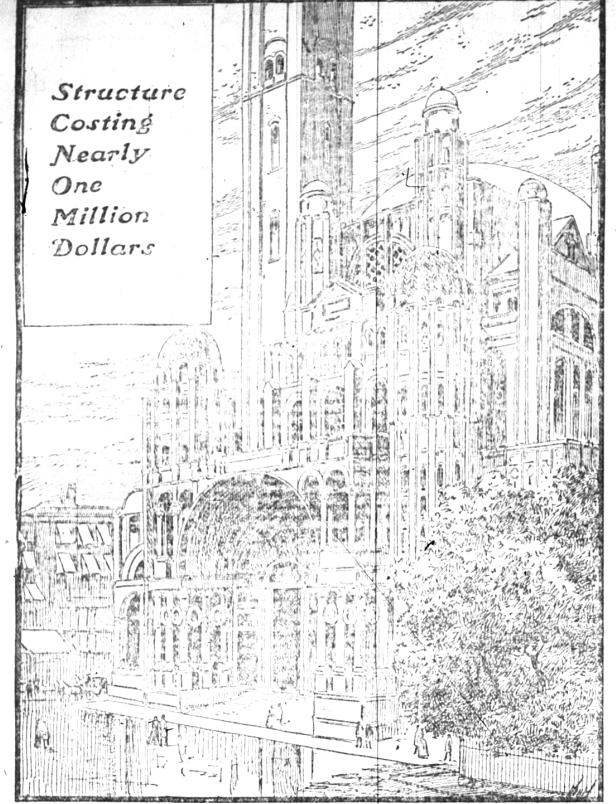


# Magnificent New Cathedral Being Erected in London

More old churches are paying off their indebtedness, and more new churches are being built. More than 1,000 new ones will be expended on religious edifices during the coming year.
