THE SUMMER HOME.
Some Furnishings Hint From an Expert Decorator.

She is a woman who furnishes summer homes for people of wealth. Being a woman, she knows far better than ten men what is needed in a home—no matter what man says to the contrary.

Having plenty of money at her command she can get the best and the newest. So her ideas are worth knowing. For there is no law against appropriating such of them as may be carried out at less cost, if one's means are limited.

Do not move furnishings from city home to the summer abode. It is a mistake for the idea is to get away from the formal furnishings of town and produce that complete change of atmosphere in such a tone to tired nerves and bodies.

As a rule, people try to put too much stuff in summer homes. The better way is to plan carefully, but to seek to produce an effect of space rather than over-crowding.

Do not decorate the walls with gay-colored papers, as one wants to get away from wall paper in the summer.

Stained or painted walls are the best, and if white plaster do them in linings, in denim or in matting, different colors in different ways. It can be tacked over the walls, hanging as neatly and as closely as wall paper, but giving that rich look that one finds only in studies in town, for the artists all use burlap for their wall.

For the floor, a matting is excellent for sitting rooms and dining rooms, or, if the floors be of hardwood, there are the rugs from Japan that come in such gay colorings. Matting, however, is cleaner than rugs, and unless there are plenty of servants, it is a more economical floor covering.

For windows, dotted Swiss and ruffled curtains are prettier, neatly hung and tied back so that the summer winds will not play havoc with them.

There should be at least a few pictures in the summer cottages, and these should be different from the pictures in the town house. Posters framed and hung in the open air make the best pictures for country homes.

British furniture is always cool, comfortable and practical. The weathered oak is good for a dining room and hall, and there should be plenty of commodious piazza chairs and rattan settees or couches.

For table furnishings in the summer home nothing is prettier or more suitable than the blue and white Japanese china that is so plentiful just now, but which many people do not care to use, because of its inexpressiveness. Yet this is that which recommends it to the summer cottager—Philadelphia Telegraph.

RECIPES

Peanut Sandwiches—Cut slices of bread into rounds with a biscuit cutter; spread each piece with a little whipped cream; point each peanut butter and sprinkle thickly over the cream. These are delicate for afternoon luncheon.

Corn Bread—Add a cup of hot boiled rice to a scant quart of white cornmeal; beat in a tablespoonful of shortening and four eggs; add a pinch of salt and a teaspoonful of soda and enough buttermilk to make a thin batter; bake in a deep pan.

Mock Oysters—Open one can of corn trout; add to it one teaspoonful of salt, a little pepper, two eggs well beaten, one-half cup of flour; the mixture should be stiff enough to drop off a spoon; fry in hot fat; drain on paper; arrange on a folded napkin; a hard head may go with a tender heart.
