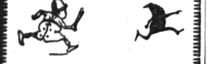

NEW YORK POSTMASTER DEAD.

Cornelius Van Cott, postmaster of New York city, died suddenly Oct. 25, of heart failure, following an attack of indigestion.

Mr. Van Cott had been a vigorous man, but of late had been subjected to an unusual amount of trouble, and this is believed to have undermined his health. He assisted in the establishment of a commercial agency and signed notes to a large amount. The concern failed and Mr. Van Cott was called upon to pay over \$25,000, which took practically the savings of a life-time.

LOUST PLAGUE OF EGYPT.

How insects were killed during their last invasion.

There is every probability of the plague of locusts which have now descended on Egypt proving a very serious one, says the London Mail.

The locusts first arrive in companies of small numbers, but they multiply very rapidly as soon as they reach the edge of cultivation.

Within ten days the young insects, though still without wings, become a solid phalanx, sometimes two or three feet deep and several miles in length.

It is essential that at this stage they should be destroyed, as it would be impossible to check the ravages of flying locusts.

The method adopted during the last invasion, that of 1890, was to dig deep trenches, sometimes miles in length, between which and the advancing locusts were piled up heaps of straw

and laid off.

Locusts which succeeded in escaping the flames and smoke fell into the trenches and were there destroyed by natives under the supervision of English instructors.

It is a proverbial habit of young locusts never to turn back or aside when started, no matter what obstacles are put in their way.

NEW PRESIDENT OF ARGENTINA.

Well-known lawyer at the head of Dr. Quintana's campaign.

Dr. Manuel Quintana, who took his seat as president of the Argentine Republic on Oct. 12, was elected constitutional head of the state for six years last July. He is well known in London-Argentine railway circles, and has been consulting lawyer to the most important lines in Buenos Ayres for more than a decade.

Dr. Quintana had made a previous bid for the presidency, and has been minister of the interior.

Large Crop from Small Seed.

Three years ago as Fred Hancock of Coventry, Vt., was picking over beans he discovered a small black seed, probably a seed from a potato ball, which he planted in a common flower pot.
