ELECTRIC LOCOMOTIVE FOR NEW YORK CENTRAL AND HUDSON RIVER RAILROAD COMPANY.

This will be the heaviest steam railway passenger service which has ever been handled by electric locomotives. With one of these locomotives trains of ten or more cars will be hauled at an express speed of 60 to 70 miles per hour, and the design and method of control are such that two or more locomotives can be coupled together and operated by a single engineer from the leading cab, so that the size of the train that may be under the control of one engineer is practically unlimited so far as the question of motive power is concerned.

For purpose of testing this locomotive, six miles of the New York Central track between Schenectady and Hoffmans has been equipped with a third rail. The track is practically straight and ballasted to permit maximum speeds of 70 to 80 miles per hour being attained.

The power is transmitted at 11,000 volts; the transmission line extending along the Erie Canal to about opposite the sub-station, where it crosses the Mohawk River on high towers.

This power station, transmission line, sub-station equipment and the six miles of track is, undoubtedly, the most complete testing plant ever provided for trial of electric railroad motive power, and with the facilities afforded, in addition to testing the new locomotives, much interesting and valuable Electric Railroad information will unquestionably be obtained.
