# KANSAS FLOODS.

All of the best bottoms on the Missouri side, including the Union depot and the wholesale district of Kansas City, are again suffering from a heavy rain storm started in at Kansas City, extending east to Topeka, which will send the Kaw still higher.

Amorously, the packing house practice in Kansas City, has been practically deserted, many of its employees having been driven from their homes by the overflow of the Kaw river for the second time in 13 months.

West and south in Kansas and Oklahoma serious conditions exist, although North Topeka, where many were crowded in last year's flood and from which hundreds fled, gradually resuming its normal condition.

At Wichita, Emporia and Winfield, the overflow of the Neosho and the Arkansas rivers are causing a disastrous flood.

George Gilbert, of Kansas City, Kan., is using all the means at his disposal to care for the hundreds of homeless people who have been driven from their homes by the water.

Thursday night he sent the following telegram to the Secretary of War: "Ten thousand people are driven from their homes in Kansas by the overflow of the Kaw river. I earnestly request that you direct the War Department to take steps to relieve the suffering of these people."
