**How Weeds Come In.**  
Weeds come into new regions largely through the carelessness of the land owner. One of the commonest ways of bringing them in is to import them in screenings from flour mills from other mills that clean grain and sell the screenings. Probably some of our states have a law like that in the Northwest Territories of Canada, which prohibits the sale of screenings except to feeders of sheep and then under certain restrictions.
