THE HUNTING LAW

SYNOPSIS OF SEELYE ACT PROHIBITING SUNDAY SPORT.

No Warrants Required for Arrest of Violators.

The Eccentric has been requested to publish the Seelye law for the prevention of Sunday hunting in Oakland county, and in compliance gives the following synopsis of the act approved April 19, 1905.

"The penalty attached is a fine of a possible \$25 and costs, or imprisonment in the county jail not more than thirty days, or both, as the Court may determine.
