# Old Fort Gibson Church

An effort is now being made to preserve the "old church on the hill" at Fort Gibson, I. T., the oldest building in the Territory. This church was the oldarrison church at Fort Gibson during all the early days of the West and was afterward used as a school house, with Henry M. Stanley, then a young man, as its teacher. The old building has been occupied continuously since 1822. Gen. Hazen while residing here was married and brought to the fort his bride, Miss Elizabeth of Cincinnati, Ohio, now the wife of Gen. George Hazen. She is said to have been the most stylish woman who ever lived in Fort Gibson and occupied the large stone building still standing on Garrison street in the old town. Her name is remembered here.

Fort Gibson, the oldest town in Indian Territory, is rich in historic lore, much of which has been written, but most of which is yet unrecorded. Settled shortly after the Louisiana Purchase, there was established a military post, which has been the scene of distinguished men have lived there, some now resting in the United States National cemetery, about a mile from the old fort, where 2,400 soldiers are buried and where may be seen the names of a number of celebrated soldiers, scouts and warriors who figured

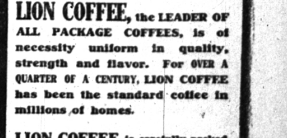
