UNIONS GET BAD SETBACK

Recent Strike in New York Results in Disruption of Organizations.

In its quarterly bulletin, which is the first that covers a period since the Communist movement took office in Albany, N. Y., the state department of labor speaks of the disastrous effect of recent strikes upon the labor organizations that prosecuted them.

The failure of the strike on the Hudson canal system in New York, says the statement, "resulted in the disruption of unions embracing a membership of more than 4000 men. That of the gladiators was followed by the dissolution of a union of 100 men, and the failure of a strike in the Fulton county glass manufacture also caused very serious losses."

In some instances, trade has only recently recovered from the recent losses, which greatly weakened the workmen's organizations. In New York several unions have been dissolved, and 8741 members left, while in the entire state 37,414 men have quit unions. 105 organizations have been disbanded and 3200 members have been discharged from the unions. In the same time only 99 new unions were organized.
