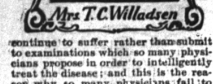

Opening of the Great  
Vintah Indian Reservation

President Roosevelt on July 15 signed the proclamation providing for the opening to homesteaders and townsite entry of the unallotted lands in the great Uintah Reservation in Utah.

The Reservation contains 2,445,000 acres, but the Military and Forestry Reserves and such Mineral lands as have to be withdrawn under existing

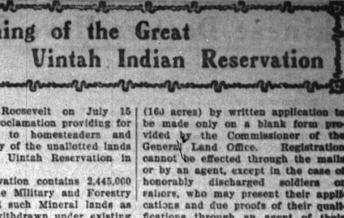
laws will leave 1,069,000 acres available for entry. Registration for the land will commence August 1st and close August 12th.

Registration may be made at Grand Junction, Colo., and Vernal, Price and Provo, Utah. Prospective settlers may register at any one of these places from 9:00 a. m., Tuesday, August 1st, until 6:00 p. m., Saturday, August 12th.

To obtain registration, each applicant must appear at one of the registration places and show himself duly qualified to make homestead entry

own selection, having a duly executed power of attorney, on a blank for that purpose provided by the Commissioner. No person will be permitted to act as agent for more than one soldier or sailor, and no one will be allowed to register more than once in any other than his true name.

The procedure necessary to secure lands in this great government reservation is outlined in detail in a pamphlet just issued by the Forest and Game Department & Rio Grande Railroad. Write to S. K. Hooper, Gen'l P. & A., Denver, Colo.
