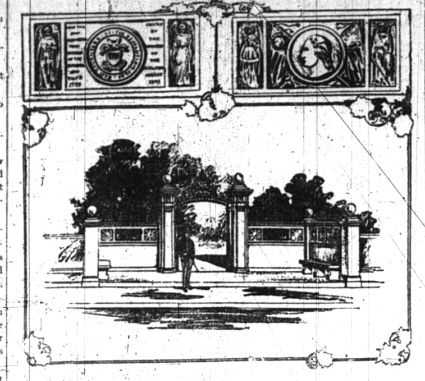

Plans for the historic arch which is to be erected in one of the entrances to the old Cambridge (Mass.) common by the national society, Daughters of the Revolution, have been approved, and the work will begin immediately.

The idea of this arch was suggested to the national society, Daughters of the Revolution, by Mrs. Adeline P. Fitz, president of the state society of Massachusetts.

The reasons presented by Mrs. Fitz were that it was in New England that the American revolution had its birth. It was in Cambridge that Washington took command of the American army.
