A Sweeping Confession.

The Boise, Idaho, Statesman has been authorized by the officers to charge of the prosecution of the five men charged with the murder of Frank Steuneger by that Steve Adams, one of the men who was arrested at Haines, Ore., on February 20, has made a full and sweeping confession.

Still another statement made by Detective McFarland was that the 'star' had confessed to a large number of murders that were not referred to in any manner by Orchard's confession.
