COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (OFFICIAL) REGULAR MEETING. BIRMINGHAM, APRIL 9, 1906. President Johnston in the chair. Trustees present, Snow, Mills, Crawford, Schlaack, Whitehead and O'Neal.

GENERAL EXPENSES. F. Haganman \$4.07, N. O'Neal 2.00, Wilson Rogers 49.40, WATER WORKS FUND, F. Smith 1.83, J. H. Handall 50.10, F. Blakeslee 6.03, HIGHWAY FUND, Wm. Jones 1.85, John Allen 5.56, Alfred C. Carter 4.69, A. J. Stuffer made a report on a fire alarm system. Whitehead moved supported by O'Neal that the matter be referred to the Water Works committee. Carried.

J. Lynch Jones offered a franchise for an electric light system. Whitehead moved supported by Snow that the franchise be referred to a special committee of three. Carried. The Pres. appointed Whitehead, Snow and O'Neal.

Bond of Geo. H. Satterlee as Clerk in the sum of two thousand dollars with F. Haganman and F. Ford as sureties and bond of M. E. Hill as Treasurer in the sum of six thousand dollars with F. Blakeslee and A. R. Parks as sureties were read and on motion accepted.

The President appointed Wilson Bray as marshal. Whitehead moved supported by O'Neal that the appointment of Wilson Bray as village marshal be confirmed. Carried.

The Pres. appointed Dr. J. L. Campbell health officer. Snow moved supported by O'Neal that the appointment be confirmed. Carried.

The Pres. appointed the following standing committees:—Ways and Means; Whitehead, Mills and Crawford. Claims; Mills, Schlaack and Snow. Streets and Sidewalks; Crawford, O'Neal and Whitehead. Cemetery and Parks; Schlaack, Mills and Whitehead.

Lamps and Lighting; Whitehead, Snow and Crawford. The Pres. moved supported by Crawford that the appointments be confirmed. Carried.

The Pres. appointed John K. Myer street commissioner. Whitehead moved supported by Snow that the appointment be confirmed. Carried.
