TO WHAT KIND OF A PHYSICIAN SHOULD WE APPLY FOR TREATMENT FOR A CURE FOR CANCER

Of All Diseases With Which the Civilized Races of Flinking Are Affected, that Hladly Various Known as "Cancer" is the Greatest Affliction, the Worst of Sickness and One of the Most Deadly.

This is an age of specialism in nearly every branch of human endeavor. As in the case with other callings, the practice of the healing art has been divided and fenced off into a number of recognized departments, that physicians restrict their study to and acquire special experience and skill in the recognition and treatment of certain classes or groups of disease that form their peculiar practice.

Nature, structural confection, or physiological and pathological relationship are more or less bound together and interdependent.

This division of labor is a great convenience to the physician. It contracts and circumscribes his work. Still a general practitioner must have a knowledge of all ailments of the human system or he cannot make a first-class success in his specialty. Although specialty practices serve to simplify the physician's work, it undoubtedly tends to confuse the layman or woman and make it difficult for them to decide regarding where to seek the relief they desire.

When the writer called on Dr. E. Mather, at his offices 83 Park Place East, he was found very busy and with quite a number of patients waiting to see him. Some with stomach troubles, others with cancers and tumors in various parts. Some of these while waiting spoke freely of the satisfactory progress and treatment for their cases. They had come from many hundreds of miles apart and were under Dr. Mather's system of treatment. We learned of a number of cases no under treatment which were looked upon as incurable of cancer of the stomach; which are making rapid progress for recovery.

A number of cases from Canada and elsewhere were discharged last week, cured.

Tumors usually originate in tissues which are of like structure with that of the tumor itself. Connecting tissues, epithelial tumors in epithelium, etc., malignant tumors, new tumors are started in distant tissues and organs by means of the dissemination of bits of tissue from the primary growth through the blood and lymph. These are known as heterologous tumors.

Some tumors are congenital; notably the naevi or vascular tumors. In some cases there appears to be a distinct hereditary tendency of cancer which is greatly exaggerated in the minds of the laity, for, while the occurrence of cancer in several generations has been observed, the absence of cancer in the children and grandchildren of persons who have been afflicted with it, and malignant forms has been equally noted. Again, the doctor says inflammation resulting from injury, especially from long continued slight irritation, seems to be frequent cause of tumor, which in some instances leads to the formation of cancer; in others, to the formation of cancer. In some cases, the cancer is followed by the development of sarcoma; also injury, as for example from a blow, a fall, or a crash not infrequently precedes the development of cancer or fibrotic growth.

Cancer of the tongue or lip is often traceable to the constant irritation of a broken clay pipe or of a broken-off tooth. In general, it would seem that tumors of the connective tissue type (sarcoma) most frequently follow a simple injury, for example, from a blow, while tumors of the epithelium type (epithelioma, carcinoma) are more apt to occur as the result of frequently repeated irritations or chronic inflammations. This is evident in the frequent association of cancer of the liver with cirrhosis of that organ. Again, malignant tumors or cancer not infrequently start their starting point in such local malformations as skin warts. Again, the doctor says that the age and sex play an important role among the predisposing causes of tumor. He goes on to say that epithelial cancer carcinoma is rare in persons under 30 years of age. This also informs us that cancer of the breast is for many centuries in the female, being in some cases commencing in childhood and is undoubtedly due to the developmental functional activity of that organ in the female. Still cancer of the tongue and lip is, on the other hand, much more common in the male, this being probably due to the fact that frequent irritation from smoking being more common in that sex.

Dr. Mather further goes on to say that the primary causative factor in the production of tumors varies. Of the many theories which have been advanced in explanation of tumor growth, probably the most ingenious and the one which at present greatest credence is given is during embryonal development. Some cells stop developing, and these cells may either remain in among tissues of their own kind or may become displaced in the course of further development of the surrounding tissues and so come to lie among other tissues. These cells may be dormant for long periods until something in their environment calls them into activity, when they proceed to develop with all the potential growth of young embryonal cells. Furthermore, being unimpeded by the wear and tear of physiological activity, they are in the case with normal tissues and organs, they are free to devote their entire energies to growth.
