Fifteen Thousand Homeless, Great Destruction of Property Results—Latest Reports.

With the crest of the food set yet in sight and a prospect of a near approach to the immense loss from high water in February, 1934, it is probable that the estimates of the losses from this present food in Cincinnati and elsewhere are being made.
