



Roosevelt Pays Tribute To Memory of McKinley

President Speaks at Dedication of Mausoleum at Canton—Draws Lesson to Nation from Life of the Martyred Statesman.

Monument Hill, Canton, O.—The McKinley mausoleum, the tribute and gift of a nation to the memory of the martyred president, William McKinley, was dedicated Monday afternoon in the presence of hundreds of distinguished men from all parts of the United States...

Addresses were delivered by President Roosevelt, Justice William D. Brandeis, Justice Charles E. Hughes, and others. President Roosevelt's address was particularly notable for its tribute to the late president's character and the lessons his life offers to the nation.
