THE EVER READY PUMP.

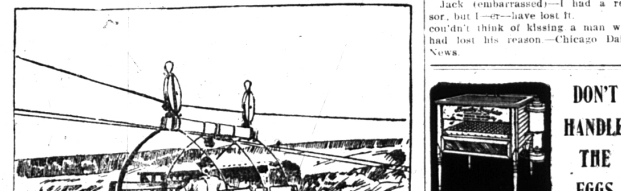
Actor Not so Gallant as the Fair Ones No Trick at All to Make Customer What He Expected.
