Lansing—Members of the Michigan M. E. conference are not anxious to see a reduction in the size of the general assembly of the denomination.

In the first place the present membership, approximately 725, is not being an unwieldy body, though by a large margin it is in fact little bigger than the Presbyterian general assembly.

In the second place—and this is the argument that generally ranks first in the secret meditations of the persons—a shrinkage in the size of the supreme legislative body will reduce the number of delegates from the Michigan conference.

This will render it more difficult for the ambitious minister or layman to struggle upward in the denomination.
