SPUR ON CONGRESS

PRESIDENT AGAIN ASKS PASSAGE OF SEVERAL LAWS.
SENDS SPECIAL MESSAGE

Washington—Conditions in both the senate and the house were such that the special message of the president furthering his views as to legislation, which was sent to congress Monday morning, found scant approval. The message arrived late in the day and the house was so tired under its new rules that it could not officially do any business until the next day. In the midst of the consideration of the naval appropriation bill under the technical rule when the document reached the body, a member of the house, the senate permitted the formal presentation of the message, but dispensed of the hour was so late and the attendance so small that no attempt was made to read the document. The message in part:


In my message to the congress of March 25, 1908, I outlined certain measures which I considered to be of our country's desire to have enacted into law at this time. These measures do not represent in any way all that I would like to have done if I thought it possible, but they do represent what I believe can now be done in the earnest effort toward this end.

Asks Injunction Legislation.

First, as to the power of injunction and of punishment for contempt. In my message I have said that immediate action is imperative, the time has come before our judgment. As regards injunctions, some such legislation as I have suggested is necessary to be enacted. They are bills which would fall to realize the extreme threat which has been made by some of our large bodies of workmen, and which has been repeatedly made of the power of injunction to labor disputes. So far as labor is engaged in production only, it claims to be exempted from the anti-trust law as sound economic policy. It is the right of laborers to combine to strike peacefully, and to enter into trade agreements with the employers. But the law is not to be construed so as to prevent the distribution and sale of the products of labor, as by the field of products. It has been the policy of our government to protect the industry in the restraint of interstate trade, and must necessarily be subject to other combinations, in the case of any other combination of the same purpose, so as to determine whether such action is contrary to the public interest. The most earnest encouragement should be given to workers to form labor unions, their employees, and to enter into agreements with their employers, and to strike, so long as they act peacefully, must be preserved. But we should not allow a boycott nor a black list which would be a great objection.
