When the conference of governors of states and men distinguished in public life of the nation met at the White House in Washington, May 12, 14, 15, in behalf of the preservation of the country's natural resources, the subject was, perhaps, the most important convention ever held in the capital was inaugurated. Among those invited to attend by President Roosevelt himself were members of the cabinet, judges of the supreme court of the United States, governors of all the states, in the nation, including the secretaries of Alaska and Hawaii, and Andrew Carnegie and William Jennings Bryan, James J. Hill, the railroad magnate, John D. Rockefeller, the oil tycoon, and other prominent scientists and business men from all over the country.
