COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

BIRMINGHAM, Aug. 11, '08. Special meeting called by President. President Daines in the chair. Trustees present—Truax, Nichols, T. B. Smith and Wilkinson. Trustees absent—Schlaack and W. E. Smith.

T. B. Smith moved, supported by Wilkinson, that the Treasurer be granted until September 10 to collect taxes. Carried.

Nichols moved, supported by T. B. Smith, that the St. Clair Edison Company be granted permission to erect electric light and power poles on Willow Avenue. Pierce Street, Maple Avenue east from Pierce Street to Woodward Avenue, and thence northerly on Woodward Avenue to the northerly limits of the village. The permission is granted to trim the tops of such shade trees as it may be necessary to make the lines safe, trimming of trees to be under the supervision of the Village Street Commissioner.

Wilkinson moved, supported by Nichols, that the \$500 bond due July 10, be paid, and interest \$75 accrued to date. Voted by roll call.

The Pacific Coast extension of the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railway now under construction, opens to the settler thousands of acres of excellent agricultural land. The new country in Adams, Hettinger, and Bowman Counties, North Dakota, and Butte County, South Dakota, is now reached by the new track. The soil is a dark loam with clay subsoil, and produces in abundance wheat, oats, barley, speltz, flax, corn and potatoes. The land is well adapted to farming, good water is found at a depth of from twenty to fifty feet, and the whole country is underlain with lignite coal that outcrops along the streams, and in most cases can be had for the digging.
