THE USUAL BIG JUNKET.

There are Many Things That Are Lined Up That Will Be of Great Interest to the People and Should Be Well Considered.

Lansing, Mich., January 25, 1909.
The past week has witnessed considerable activity in the Legislature. A good number of bills have come into the upper and lower houses, and the committee recommendations are being considered. So far as the committee recommendations are concerned, the Senate is the body in the most commendable of bills and has a monopoly in the measures aimed at primary reform. The house has three headliners in one liquor bill, but it is said the house bill which proposed to indemnify the State for the loss of property by local option was intended only as a football. It is likely that the real measure to be introduced later, as both sides are cautiously feeling of each other's strength.
