## MARKET FOR ICE IN TURKEY

Company Shaves Product Until It Resembles Snow, Which the Neighbors Demand.

There is a newly erected ice plant at Smyrna, Turkey, built by an American company, and it is now producing good business. An ice plant there has been making fifty about six tons of ice a day, which it sold at \$15 a ton. The new company makes from distilled water a fine, clear ice, which it sells at \$5 a ton, and although it has been running scarcely 10 days it is selling from 25 to 40 tons of ice daily. The company has some unique competition from the mountain folk, who bring to Smyrna snow packed in animal bags. They save the snow in the winter by having it packed in trenches and covered with pine needles.
