### DANGERS OF DRINK IN YOUTH

In Early Life Alcohol Should Be Rigidly Excluded from Diet—in Category of Tobacco.

(By H. W. Wiley, M. D., Chief of the Bureau of Chemistry.)

Attwater in his classical experiments has shown that a certain amount of alcohol can be oxidized daily by the average healthy individual. There is another question, however, which is not so generally considered in this connection, viz: that as long as alcohol is not oxidized it acts in a specially deleterious way upon certain tissues of the body. The well-known power of alcohol to coagulate albumen should not be forgotten, as the cells of the body which go to make up its organs and upon which the functions of such organs depend are composed of albuminous matter. This alcohol should not be forgotten for these reasons I entirely agree with Dr. Dana in believing that alcohol should be rigidly excluded from the diet of early life. If used, all it should do in the category of tobacco, coffee, and wine.

### Europe's Highest Village.

"The highest village in Europe" is the inscription on a post card which shows a group of wooden cottages on a bleak hill, with signs of vegetation in sight and having as a background a range of ice-covered mountains. The village is in the Canton Wallis, 4,214 meters above the sea level, where Monte Rosa raises its gigantic head into the clouds. The village consists of four families, and the latter gives it a population of 26. "The storms of spring and fall and the snow of the winter months," says the leader of the card, "make life here a dreary one, and still the people look happy, and doubtless they are so."

### AMERICAN ABUSE OF OPIUM

Alleged Many Members of Medical Profession Are Addicts to its Use in Home Form.

The International Opium commission, which avers its inception to America, sets forth a few facts concerning the opium evil in this country. In 1907, 14,123 pounds of crude opium (10% for medicinal purposes) and only 15,016 pounds of smoking opium were imported. In addition to this it is estimated that a large amount is smuggled into this country. The crude opium originates from Smyrna and the Levantine ports, while the bulk of Mexican and Hong Kong supply the smoking opium. There are 100,000 to 150,000 smokers among the white and colored population. Among the general criminal population 15.48 per cent are smokers, as are 56.2 per cent of prisoners. An incredible allegation is that ten per cent of the medical profession in 25 states are addicts to the use of opium in one form or another. There is an enormous growth of the morphine habit, especially in rural communities. A large percentage of these cities have become addicted to the morphine habit largely as the result of a sincere objection to the use of alcohol in any of its forms. From ten to 20 per cent of the Chinese population in every one of the United States in America there has been a per cent increase in the importation of smoking opium largely in excess of the per cent increase in population.
