GRISWOLD HOUSE

SAMUEL WHITE THOMPSON, Died in this village, Friday evening, May 7th, from paralysis, after suffering for ten days.

Although a resident of Birmingham, but a short time, his presence among us was missed for a long time. Mr. Thompson was born in Newburyport, Mass., December 7th, 1836. Coming to Detroit from New York in 1865, he built up a large cooperage business in Ovid, Mich., with his main office in the old Brady block, Detroit. Fire destroyed the Ovid plant, and he removed his business to Milwaukee Junction. Mr. Thompson retired from active business in 1891, making his home first in New York, afterwards living in Seattle, Wash., and Phoenix, Ariz.

In 1907 he came with his wife and daughter to this village. The devotion and kindness of his neighbors and friends during his illness testified that he had found not only a home in Birmingham, but a place in the hearts of its people. Mr. Thompson leaves a widow, six sons and one daughter.

The funeral took place from St. James church, on Sunday afternoon last at half past two o'clock.

MRS. MAGGIE E. LEONARD.

After a two weeks illness, from complication of diseases, Mrs. Maggie E. Leonard passed away on Monday afternoon, May 7, at one o'clock Monday afternoon.

Deceased was the widow of the late Mason N. Leonard, and was born in Troy township. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Bingham, one of the staunch old Co. pioneers families. She was united in marriage to Mason N. Leonard while quite a young woman, and is the mother of six sons, all of whom survive her. They are, Dr. Charles, of Hopping, Harry and Bart, both of Globe, Ariz.; Dr. Stuart, located in Washington; Ray, of this place, and Homer at home. The sons are all planning to be present at the funeral which will be held Saturday afternoon, and from her late home. Burial will be made in Crooks cemetery.

Besides a sister, Miss Carrie Bingham, she is survived by three brothers.

William, only son of Mr. and Mrs. William Brown, residing north-west of this village, died at his home Monday, of tuberculosis. Deceased has been in ill health for some months past, but his condition was considered serious only for the past few weeks. He was but 18 years of age, and besides his parents is survived by four sisters, Mrs. Wm. Stephens; Mrs. Lillian Slocum, of Detroit; Miss Sadie, a government nurse, in So. Dak. U. S. hospital, and Miss Alta, at home. Funeral was held yesterday, (Thursday) afternoon from his late home, Rev. Pinkerton, officiating. His remains were placed beside those of his sister, Aggie, who died of the same disease less than two months ago, in beautiful Greenwood.

Liked to Do Man's Work.

Because of the declaration of 17-year-old Annie Bugelnorth of Burlington, Conn., that she was a man because she liked it, her father, August Bugelnorth, a farmer, has been saved from going to jail. He was arrested on complaint of neighbors, who insisted that he forced the girl and the toll upon his daughter to save the wages of a hired man. The father was followed to the dock by his daughter in a high state of rage, and, after explanation before the local justice of the peace, the father was released. The girl, who is a rough working girl, overalls and a sombrero, said that she could not be happy without continued life in the open air and plenty of work.

"I can make a man's wages," she said, "and I can have all a man's fun. I'm not doing any harm and I want to be let alone. There are not men enough in this town, anyway. I'm just stepping out of the way to make room for the girls who are so crazy about getting married."

Birth of the German Navy

A Few Facts Showing the Wonderful Progress Made in Building Up a Marine Power.

Some idea of the wonderful progress of the German navy is gained when one realizes that Vice-Admiral Reinhold von Werner, whose death is announced at the age of 84, saw practically the birth of that navy as we now know it. When the German fleet

retirement in 1878 he held the command of the Baltic station. He devoted the last 30 years of his life to the patriotic task of popularizing the idea of sea power which he had seen grow from insignificant proportions to a strength which has done so much to stimulate the shipbuilding of other nations. He was a prolific writer, and his authority extended over a long period. Even at the time of the Battle of Jassund he attracted attention by a work on the Prussian navy, its present and its future.
