## COUNTY HOUSEWAITING ROOM MEMORIAL DAY

And What Birmingham People Are Doing to Help Shorten the Weary Hours of the Aged

Last fall the Oakland county Federation of Women's clubs voted to pay 10 cents per capita to a fund to be used to make things brighter and more home like at the county house.

The committee consists of Miss Baldwin, of Birmingham, chairman; Mrs. Sibley, of Pontiac; Mrs. Vliet, of Clarkston; Mrs. Fellshaw, of Holly; and Mrs. Pierce, of Farmington.

This committee visited the county home and after consulting with the officials, decided upon the purchase of an organ for the use of the women, several of whom could play and some more could sing. After much delay an organ was shipped from this village last week. With it was sent a number of pictures, donated by benevolent people, and a quantity of macarines.

In the selection of an instrument, and in preparing it for shipment, etc., the committee was greatly assisted by our obliging townman, Mr. A. Baxter, without whose help they could not have succeeded.

A kind woman (not a club woman) asked permission to contribute to the cause and gave money. This money goes into the federation treasury and will help very much.

The organ donated by Mr. and Mrs. Kozmick could not be made available, and with their consent, was made into a much needed desk for the library.

The one finally sent to the home was sold to the committee by Mrs. Thurlow for a very small sum because of the good it was to do, and repaired by Mr. Baxter, is now a new organ and will help to shorten the weary hours of those whose sickness and misfortune have deprived of home and family.

The expense is met by the federation but the generous donations of work, pictures and money have come from this village whose motto is, "We will work for Birmingham."
