ZEPHYR, A TEXAS TOWN, IS MADE DESOLATE BY A FIERCE TORNADO.

A Tornado wrecked Zephyr, a village in Brown County, Iowa, on Monday, killing more than 30 persons, seriously wounding 50, and hurting a score of others.

No effort was made to fight the fire, as the care of the dead and wounded was the first attention.
