On the death of Queen Victoria, January 21, 1901, Edward succeeded to the throne. The coronation was set for the 26th of June, and all preparations for the magnificent event had been completed when disquieting rumors of the king's ill health, which had been current for several days, were confirmed by the postmaster of the ceremony. It was announced that the king was suffering from peripneumonia, and on June 24 the king underwent an operation. After some weeks of the strictest rest he recovered, and the coronation took place August 9.

During the last years of his reign Edward's public duties consisted of the office of representing the royal family at all manner of public events, and he performed these duties well. But the deadly monstrosity of such a life was too much for him. He died at Sandringham, Norfolk, on May 7, 1910, at the age of 68 years.
