IMPORTANCE OF GOOD LIGHT AND VENTILATION

One of Common Errors in Building Stables Is Failure to Provide Windows and Ventilators in Sufficient Numbers.

One of the common errors in building stables is to fail to provide windows and ventilators in sufficient numbers. In the cheaper barns it is the light especially that is usually left out of the calculation. This is one of the most serious mistakes when we stop to think of how clean light really is, and how valuable it is as a germicide.

Many of the diseases of live stock may be attributed to germs. Tuberculosis is caused by specific germs. The myriads of germs that escape from tubercular animals confined in a barn are disseminated through the stables, and sunlight is a factor in the destruction of these germs.

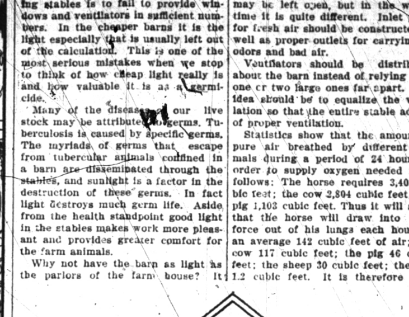
