Turks Prepare to Wage Diplomatic Controversy to Save Territory.

The Turkish delegate will be Osman Nizami Pasha, who has been officially handed in to the foreign office. The Ottoman government has been puzzled to select the best men.

HOUSE MEETS IN CHICAGO

Progressives Plan to Push Program Before State and National Assemblies.

Frank's bidding for the confidence of the nation in its moral and intellectual leadership, the progressive party will first pitch a legislative, constructive program before a conference in Chicago this week that will be pressed on congress and the legislatures of the several states with all the force that the new party can organize behind it.

Experts are now at work framing a series of eight bills that will constitute the minimum legislative program for progressives in the Illinois legislature. There are a short ballot measure, initiative and referendum, and a constitutional amendment providing for a complete new popular primary law, corrupt practices act, minimum wage legislation, public utilities legislation, a measure for the protection of railroad employees, and adoption of the famous Kansas "blue sky" law to control the sale of securities and insure that their shareholders are protected behind them they may be marketed.

These measures, adapted to the requirements of each state, will be presented and pushed wherever there is a legislature in session. They constitute the backbone of the people's rule program of the new party, and are confident that the many legislatures under the spur of the public demand which the progressive campaign has aroused will now pass on these things the present winter.

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WASHINGTON OFFICIALS SAY REINDEER WILL SUPPLANT CATTLE.

Washington—U.S. Sam has undertaken many big problems of late in an effort to solve the mystery of the continued rise in the cost of food. But it is doubtful if any of them will have a greater effect on this vital question than the experiment to find a new meat supply. Every one agrees that the most problem is the greatest of all. It was this year that the government first undertook the experiment of raising reindeer on the barren slopes of Alaska. The scheme has now progressed far beyond the experimental stage, and the men who have charge of it say that reindeer will cut a big figure in the future supply of American meat.

Officials at Washington say that in less than 30 years, if the increase continues at the present rate, there will be more than 2,000,000 reindeer in Alaska, upon which the people of America can depend for much of their flesh diet in the future.

In favor of the meat is the fact that it is more palatable than beef, but is even more palatable than either.
