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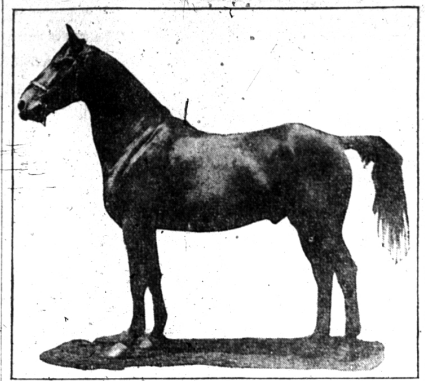
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EXPERIMENTS IN BREEDING HORSES FOR U. S. CAVALRY

The public generally knows that the government has outlined a plan to encourage the breeding of horses for the army whereby many owners in suitable sections will have the command of service to first-class stallions free, in return for which they agree to give the United States option on resulting foals at a fair price. The plan was taken up as a measure to provide a good supply of horses such as the army needs, which, strange as it may seem, is rapidly becoming more and more limited. An appropriation was suggested at the last session of congress, but no action was taken. The objection being that the plan was not practical—that farmers would not enter into such agreements with the government.

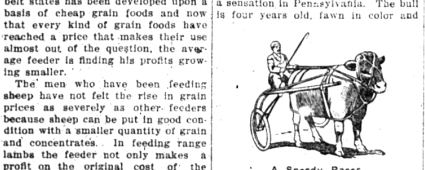
RANGE LAMBS RETURN PROFITS

EGGS PRODUCED BY HEN IN YEAR

About Five Dozen Per Fowl is Fair Estimate, Counting Good, Bad and Indifferent.

According to statistics the average number of eggs laid by each hen in this country foot up about five dozen. This is counting the good, bad and indifferent. But if the statistics were taken from poultry farm reports exclusively the average would be ten dozen. The average farmer in care, less with his fowls, and does not, as a rule, gather all the eggs the hens lay for the reason that in their native state they have hidden nests and the eggs in consequence are often lost. With the improved methods of breeding, the average with the poultry men will in a few years run as high as 150 eggs per hen per annum. Individual records have been reported that are fast, for the market value of the hens as well as the eggs which they will ever get near it.

WOULD PROHIBIT BREWERIES OWNING SALOONS, URGES DIRECT VOTE ON STATE OFFICERS

SUGGESTS EQUAL SUFFRAGE BE PUT UP FOR V.O.E.
In Five Messages to Legislature He Deals With Much Legislation—Would Curb Bonding Company.

Gov. Osborn submitted five special messages to the legislature Monday night. In a specific term he asks the legislature to pass a woman's suffrage bill, and a state-wide primary bill, providing for the submission of an amendment to the constitution providing for the election of active, preferential and recall; pass a bill amending the banking laws so as to secure the public savings funds; a bill making it unlawful for brewers or wholesale liquor dealers to own or operate saloons, and a bill to repeal the charter of the Michigan Bonding Company which furnishes bonds for the saloonkeepers.

The Messages.

The messages in full are as follows: To the Forty-ninth legislature of the State of Michigan.
I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your message of the 21st of January, 1919, and to inform you that the same has been referred to the appropriate committee of the House of Representatives.
