SUGGESTIONS TO FARMERS.

1. Improve your poultry stock.

2. Keep one of the general purpreeds, such as the Plymouth R Wyandotte, Orpington, or Rhode

breeds, such as the Plymouth Rock, Wyandotte, Ornigton, or Rhode Island Red.

5. Provide one clean, dry, verminfree nest for every four or five hers.

4. Conclude all, hatching by May 15, and sell or confine male birds during the remainder of the summer.

5. Gather eggs daily during ordinary times and twice daily during not or rainy weather.

6. In summer, place eggs as soon as guthered in a cool, dry room.

7. Use all small and dirty eggs a home or expect less than market price at stores.

8. Market eggs regularly and frequently, at least twice a week. Never hold eggs. Eggs should have as good care as milk.


