Politics

A call to the people of the United States and Mrs. Betty Boyd open house "National Progressive movement," to send delegates to a national convention to open in Chicago August 5, was given at New York City by United States Senator Dixon, Theodore Roosevelt's campaign manager. The call is signed by members of the committee chosen at a meeting held in Chicago a month to six weeks during the heat period.

The American Whist League began its annual season and contests in New York, Ellsworth Elliot, Jr., presiding.

The annual meeting of the National Municipal League in Los Angeles attracted a large number of experts on civic affairs.

Five persons were killed and 17 injured when an interurban car crashed into a "dead end" car at a quarter of a mile east of Sand Springs park at Tulsa, Okla.

Twenty-two persons were killed and more than thirty injured, several fatally, when a heavy freight train crashed into an engine and passenger car at the intersection of the tracks at the Ligonier Valley railroad. The trains came together on a sharp curve. Every person in the coach was either killed or injured.

Fifty employes of the New Richmond (Wis.) Roller Mills company have been awarded a quarter of 1 per cent, and street laborers had their wages increased to \$2.25 a day.

Sporting

Jim Flynn's butting tactics brought the captain of the New Mexico state police into the ring in the ninth round of the championship bout between Gas and Referee Smith gave Johnson the decision. Both men transgressed the rules, Johnson by holding, and Flynn by butting. Referee Smith, the greater offender. The decision was given to Johnson because he had the better of the fighting up to that time.

Ad Wolgast retained his championship by beating Joe Rivera, Mexican challenger, in a desperate battle which lasted six rounds at the Coliseum in New York. Wolgast was too rugged for Rivera.

Washington

The report of the judiciary committee presented to the house at Washington by its chairman, Judge Henry Clay, containing recommendations for the impeachment of Judge Robert W. Archbald of the United States commerce court, characterized the accused jurist as a man whose sense of moral responsibility has become "deadened."

Introduction of a "flag" rule to insure that the flag be used in the Clayton contempt bill, precipitated a bitter fight in the house at Washington. The rule, which prevented any amendments being attached to the bill and limited general debate to three hours, was adopted.

The senate judiciary committee at Washington decided to report favorably the nomination of William M. Bullitt of Louisville, Ky., to be solicitor general to succeed Mr. Lehmann.

A bill to penalize desertion of the flag and coat-of-arms of the United States and to prevent their use for advertising, patent or copyright purposes, was introduced by Senator Washington by Representative Cox of Ohio. His bill would make the Grand Army of the Republic the only organization allowed to use the flag as an emblem.

The senate passed the naval appropriation bill, which provides for an appropriation of approximately \$133,000,000, the largest sum ever allowed the naval establishment. Among other things the senate measure provides for two first-class battleships, where none has been provided for in the house bill, and increases the number of submarines from four to six.

A. Platt Anderson tendered his resignation to President Taft as assistant secretary of the treasury. In an April letter to the president, Mr. Anderson charges that subordinates in the treasury department "have been hampered and discouraged at every turn by Secretary MacVeagh's misapprehensions and his incapacity for decision."

In a statement given out at Manchester, Mass., Secretary of the Treasury Franklin MacVeagh relates the history of the dispute which led up to the resignation of Assistant Secretary Anderson and declares that Anderson was requested to resign by himself (MacVeagh).

Delegates from all parts of the country arrived in Washington to participate in a convention of the International Bible Students' association at Glen Echo, Md.

Thirty persons were thrown into the water of Jamaica Bay, New York, when a pier on Plum Island gave way under the stampede of a crowd rushing for the ferry boat. Despite quick measures for rescue, one man and two children were drowned.

The charred spinal column of a year-old baby was found in the ashes of the debris at the scene of the Lackawanna wreck near Corning, N. Y. This brings the number of victims to 40.

Three sisters were drowned in the Merrimack river at Salisbury Point, Mass., while their father stood on the opposite bank, watching the disaster. The victims were Christine, Virginia and Hazel McBeth.

Flying through a dense fog at 25 miles an hour, west-bound Lackawanna train No. 11 crashed into the rear passenger train No. 10, near Corning, N. Y., three miles east of Corning, N. Y., killing 41 persons and injuring between fifty and sixty.

REPUBLICAN

13 Articles of Impeachment Filed With House of Representatives.

Chairman Henry D. Clayton of the committee on judiciary, head of representatives presented the house 13 articles of impeachment against Judge Robert W. Archbald of the U. S. court of commerce. Mr. Clayton's report was unanimous from the committee. Republicans as well as Democrats voted for bringing the judge to trial.

It constitutes the ninth impeachment of a judicial officer by the government, and is the first since the impeachment of Judge John Pickens Swaine of the northern district of Florida, who was acquitted on Feb. 27, 1875.

The conduct of this judge has been exceedingly reprehensible and in marked contrast with the high sense of judicial ethics and probity that generally characterize the federal judiciary," the committee said in summarizing its findings of misbehavior in office against Judge Archbald.
