PIGS ARE SECRET OF SUCCESS IN MAKING SWINE PROFITABLE

A Money Making Bunch.

Warmth and protection during the first few days and sufficient amount of nutritious foods and fresh air and plenty of sunshine later on make for plenty of pigs that bring profits to the breeder.

It from a well-nourished dam and a healthy strain of animals the pigs rarely need attention at farrowing time. A quiet sow does not object to the presence of the attendant, and will usually be helped to suck without irritating the sow. Nervous sows are often beat left alone. In very cold weather some artificial heat may be necessary in the farrowing pen.

At three or four weeks of age the pig will begin to pay attention to his mother's feed. This is to be encouraged, and as soon as the pigs are eating well, a creep to pig feeding lot should be provided. Skim-milk is the standard pig feed, but some grain

hogs to have a dipping tank of some sort and dip his hogs at least once a month, without regard as to whether they are troubled with lice or not. It is best to keep their skin in fine condition and contribute materially to their health.

GREEN RYE TO COWS AND HORSES

Feeding Should Be in Hands of Careful Man and Not Given to Boys of Careless Hand.

Green rye may be fed as soon as it heads out. There is then the most nutritious time for feeding. Cut when free from dew, and let it wilt a few hours before feeding. Feed small quantities at first. A half forkful may be given to each cow after the hay has been eaten. When fed thus there is no danger of bloat or hoven.

The feeding of green feed to cattle should be done in the hands of a careful man and not given to a careless hand. Attention to this rule will frequently save the life of a valuable cow.

Horses will not show after the green feed, as it is liable to produce colic. Cows should not be turned out to pasture until early in the morning. If hay has been made up in the barn there is some nourishment in the grass. Before turning out to grass the pasture should be cut or grazed first. After the hay is eaten they are turned on the pasture. For the first day or two let them graze one or two hours at a time.

When he took cement, mixing it in proportion of one part of cement to four parts sand, and plastered this over like a plaster, plastering the cement directly on the brickwork. A coating of cement had thoroughly set he washed the inside with pure cement, to make it absolutely tight.

Whether it is safe to plaster the cement directly on the dirt, as done by my neighbor, depends on the character of the soil. Ordinarily, however, I plan the better; that is, to build the frame six inches smaller than the hole and fill in the space all around with concrete.
