PRELIMINARY ESTIMATE FROM WASHINGTON SHOWS BUMPER YIELD OF SPRING WHEAT. CORN IS CONSIDERABLY ABOVE THE AVERAGE.

Increase Made in Production of Oats, Rye, Barley, White Potatoes, and Hay—Michigan Oats Encouraging.

This year's grain crops in the United States will be far in excess of last year's yield. It was estimated Saturday by the department of agriculture.

The country's corn crop, estimated at 2,311,000,000 bushels, will be the largest in the nation's history.

Michigan is expected to produce 7,250,000 bushels of winter wheat of a quality rated at 73. The unusual weather in the state has reduced the corn crop to 43 condition rated at 72.

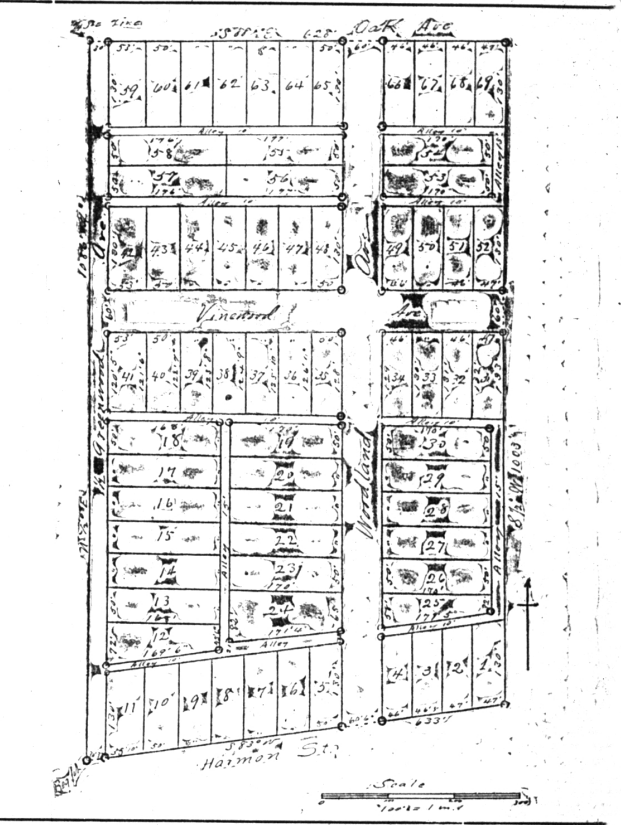
