

John Beal Broad, the Ambridge (Ill.) banker, who was arrested at the home of E. Boyce in Port Worth on February 14, shot and killed "Al" Boyce, son of Captain Boyce. The murder is the tragic climax of a series of events which began when "Al" Boyce eloped with Mrs. Lena Sneed, wife of the slayer, last winter.

Sidna Allen, leader of the Allen clan, which shot up the Carroll county courthouse at Hillsville, Va., March 14, killing Judge Massey and others, and his nephew, Wesley Edwards, were arrested in Des Moines, Ia., as a result of love affairs which led to the slaying.

H. Murphy, a negro, confessed assassin of a well-known white woman of Alton, Fla., was taken from officers by a mob and lynched near that place, according to word received here.

Although gangs protect all crossings, the Twentieth Century Limited, train between Chicago and New York was forced to go through Laporie, Ind., at a rate of ten miles an hour. Mayor Darrow insisted that unless a young girl and her mother were taken to the Tipton street crossing the city ordinance regarding speed would be enforced. The action was the result of the killing of Mrs. Shipley last Friday, he being the twelfth victim at the crossing.

With the election of Judge Alfred H. Beers of Chicago as commander-in-chief for the ensuing year, and the placing of the selection of the next encampment city in the hands of the local committee, the forty-sixth annual encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic officially ended at Los Angeles, Cal.

Six boys were drowned when the recreation cutter of the United States naval station, near Lake bluff, Ill., was wrecked on a sand bar 300 yards off shore. The fatal accident occurred in view of a number of men and women. The furious gale that was blowing from the northeast had whipped the water of the lake into such billows that rescue was impossible.

A mysterious tunnel just discovered under the street in Court square, Boston, is thought to have been made by prisoners attempting to escape from jail cells of the three quarters of a century-old court house, recently demolished to make way for a city hall annex.

In revenge for the attention their husbands are alleged to have bestowed on Mrs. M. M. Foster, a pretty twenty-two-year-old girl, of Clarksville, near Newark, O., eight men were badly shaken up in an automobile smashup at East Lake, N. Y. Both automobiles were moving slowly at the time of the collision and none of those either car was badly injured.

Bertram C. Spencer, convicted of the murder of Miss Martha Blackstone, a school teacher of Springfield, Mass., was electrocuted at Boston. Spencer, who was disgraced at the nerve which has astonished the prison officials. His spiritual adviser was a Christian Science reader.

At the close of the first day devoted to hearing testimony in the suit brought by the government at Chicago to dissolve the International Harvester company on the grounds that it is a trust, it was announced that George W. Perkins, Charles Dearing and other men interested in the formation of the trust would not be called to the witness stand, because if they testified in the civil suit they would be immune from criminal prosecution.

Thomas Wilson, factory manager at Pontiac (Mich.) automobile company, was killed when his car was driving through over in a ditch near that city.

James Williams, a negro murderer, died in the electric chair at the state prison at Auburn, N. Y., after delivering a rambling vocabulary.

Cara, a pedigreed Italian poodle, pet of Miss Helen Taft, had been returned to her owner by the Chicago police, and there is joy in the home and she is now in the hands of her new owner. When Miss Taft was out motoring a few days ago and the poodle was left in the car and disappeared.

Howard W. Gill, Baltimore aviator, was almost instantly killed, and narrowly escaped a like fate, when two airplanes driven by them at the Chicago aviation field crashed together in midair 100 feet above the ground. Both aeroplanes sank to the ground completely wrecked, and Gill's neck was broken.

David A. Spanner of Cleveland was crushed to death and Mrs. Fred M. Meier of Indianapolis was freed from the automobile in which they were riding skidded and turned over a ditch filled with water near Toledo, O.

Three women collecting provisions for a church supper were killed when a train crashed into a rig in which they were riding at a crossing in Muskegon, Mich. The victims were Mrs. Ole Rogler, Mrs. Gertrude Witt and Mrs. Adolph Turck.

LAST OF THE ALLENS CAUGHT
Detectives Trail Sweetheart and Capture Sidna Allen and Wesley Edwards.

Handcuffed, guarded by three stalwart detectives and escorted to the jail, the last of the Allens was captured. Maude Irola, the girl who was seduced by the police the clue to their hiding place. Sidna Allen and her nephew, Wesley Edwards, the two who were in the shooting up of the Hillsville, Va., courthouse, on March 14 last, arrived in Cincinnati, Ohio, on the morning of their capture. Sidna Allen was found in the Des Moines rooming house, the officers ordered him to surrender. As he refused, the girl was taken to the jail. "I guess you've got me," he said.

Maude Irola, of Mount Airy, Va., sweetheart of Edward and the innocent cause of the arrest of the gang leaders, was nonchalant about her capture. "I don't care," she said. "I didn't think anyone would know that I was in here. He was always kind to me and we were always together. I did not know that Sidna Allen was here, but I recognized him when the officer came to the house and arrested him. It is a relief to be here."

The detective who followed the girl all the way from her home to the jail, in Des Moines, Allen was working as a carpenter and the wife was a street-paving gang, both under assumed names.
